







- Intersection redesign of Main St, providing safe crossing for greenway users






1 PROPOSED GREENWAY ROUTE ALONG UNDERHILL AVE.



Project 9 Alley Pond Park to Northern Boulevard

Proposed On-Street Improvements:

- · Shared lane Bike Boulevard on Cloverdale Blvd south of Alley Pond Park
- Expand east sidewalk at E Hampton Blvd overpass of Long Island Expy to accommodate raised bike lanes
- Safety enhancements at Northern Blvd intersection
- NYC DOT will explore onstreet connections from **Community Board 11**




