Queens Boulevard Safety Improvements

Eliot Avenue to Yellowstone Boulevard



What's Happening:

NYC DOT looks to continue a multi-year safety improvement project along Queens Blvd. This project lays the groundwork for a capital investment on Queens Blvd, a Vision Zero Priority. Between 2010 and 2014, 458 people were injured on Queens Blvd between Eliot Ave and Yellowstone Blvd. NYC DOT is seeking community feedback about your experience on Queens Blvd to shape possible safety improvements in 2017 and beyond.

What We've Done:

In 2015 and 2016, NYC DOT installed safety improvements on Queens Blvd from Roosevelt Ave to Eliot Ave. Safety improvements included installation of a protected pedestrian path and bicycle lane; stop controlled and signalized slip lanes, helped reduce speeding, and mitigated conflicts between merging vehicles. NYC DOT conducted extensive outreach and used community feedback to design improvements to the service roads to enhance safety and eliminate highway-like design features for all road users.
